Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objectives and Strategies

The investment objective of the Mawer Canadian Bond Fund (the "Fund") is to invest for interest income and capital returns primarily from bonds and debentures of Canadian government and corporate issuers. The Fund is primarily invested in a diversified portfolio of high-quality Canadian government and corporate bonds. The Fund may also invest in mortgage-backed securities, asset-backed securities or foreign securities. The Manager focuses on security, sector, credit and curve analysis in making investment decisions. Investment considerations may include interest rates, yield spreads, exchange rates, structures, credit spread and fundamental analysis of sovereign, government, corporate and structured finance issuers. For consistency of style, risk and return, only Canadian dollar securities are held with a minimum of 40% in government bonds. To limit the risk associated with unexpected movements in interest rates, the duration of the portfolio is limited to within 1 year of our benchmark, the FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index.

Risk

The risks of investing in the Fund remain as discussed in the Prospectus. The Fund is suitable for investors seeking income returns with low risk. The major risks for the Fund are interest rate risk and credit risk. To reduce interest rate risk we constrain the duration of the portfolio within narrow limits versus our benchmark. To reduce credit risk in the portfolio, the Fund only holds investment grade securities and diversifies corporate holdings by issuer and sector. We perform in-depth credit analysis and place a 5% limit on individual corporate issuer exposure.

Results of Operations

The Fund's net assets decreased 2.9% to \$3,681.8 million from \$3,792.2 million at June 30, 2024. Of this change, -\$8.8 million is attributable to negative investment performance and -\$101.6 million was due to net redemptions to the Fund.

The Manager assesses the Fund's underlying securities for liquidity on a quarterly basis. During the period the Fund has remained in compliance with National Instrument 81-102 and has maintained an illiquid concentration of less than 10% of the Fund's Net Asset Value. During the period there were no notable redemptions to the Fund that affected its liquidity.

The Fund's A-series units retreated -0.6% after management fees over the 6-month period ending June 30, 2024, versus the FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index, which returned -0.4% over the same period. All performance values provided are in Canadian dollar terms. After a slow start to the year due to rising bond yields, the second quarter was more favourable to fixed income investors.

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All told, the longer-term trend of moderating inflation remains intact but the central bank's job is not done yet. As a result, market expectations for future interest rate cuts were reduced as the U.S. Federal Reserve and Bank of Canada grappled with stubborn inflation. Nonetheless, central bankers in Canada diverged from their U.S. peers by kicking off their policy easing cycle with a 25-basis point cut to the overnight rate in June. Markets are also putting decent odds on another couple of cuts through the rest of 2024 in Canada. However, headline and core inflation remain above the 2% midpoint of the Bank of Canada's long-term target and the Bank's messaging to market participants has stressed that future policy action will be measured and data dependent.

As has been a theme for several quarters now, sector exposure contributed to relative outperformance driven by positioning within corporates. Despite corporate spreads modestly widening, the Fund added value through owning higher carry securities within corporate exposure. The impact of security selection was positive over the period owing to selection within the corporate sector.

The Fund initiated positions in 5-year and 10-year Coastal GasLink (CGL) bonds. The bonds are part of the issuer's eleven tranche public debt offering to refinance existing project finance bank debt for a recently completed 670-kilometre pipeline which will transport natural gas from the British Columbia interior to the LNG Canada facility in Kitimat (on the Pacific Coast).

The Fund also participated in several new issues. The first was a Sunlife 7-year bond, which had reasonable valuations for the term and company relative to the overall Canadian insurance space. The second was a Ford Credit Canada 4-year bond. The portfolio has been accumulating Ford paper over the last several months. Recently, Ford Credit Canada was upgraded from high yield and has a growing following of investors in Canada.

Some Government of Canada 10-year bonds were moved into Canada Housing Trust 10-year bonds. Spreads for being in this federal government agency are roughly 40 basis points, which is around the long-term average over the last ten years. The Manager felt there was an opportunity to move the needle on total portfolio carry in a reasonably liquid market without taking on incremental credit risk.

Lastly, the Fund swapped out of some 4-year Bank of Montreal legacy senior deposit notes into match-term Hydro One senior debt. The spread between the two issues is trading near the tight of the decade (limited additional carry being in bank debt today versus a regulated utility), and with delinquencies increasing at banks, there was no fundamental thesis for Bank of Montreal to continue tightening relative to a regulated utility.

This period marked the start of the next phase of this cycle, one where the Bank of Canada now officially has a bias towards easing policy rates. The questions remain when and at what pace will we see further rate cuts. The Manager's current view is that inflation will remain sticky, and as a result, cuts could be slower than market consensus.

Credit valuations remain near cycle lows despite a clear slowing of the economy. Perhaps central banks have perfectly threaded the needle and achieved the much talked about soft landing; the Manager remains skeptical. Even if this turns out to be the case, credit valuations on average appear rich and so the Fund remains conservatively positioned.

Recent Developments

There are no recent developments to report related to the strategic positioning of the Fund, the Manager, or the policies of the Independent Review Committee.

Related Party Transactions – Management Fees

The Portfolio Advisor receives management fees, which are calculated for Series A Units as 0.60% per annum of the net asset value of the Fund calculated on a daily basis. Management fees for Series O and Series S Units are payable directly to the Manager by investors and dealers respectively and not by the Fund.

The Manager of the Fund has the ability, at their discretion, to reduce the management fees for large investors. This reduction is effected by means of a management fee distribution and will be automatically reinvested in additional units of the Fund at the net asset value of the Fund on the date of distribution. Mawer also receives fees for performing administrative services. As at June 30, 2024 the Fund owes Mawer \$0 related to these administrative services.

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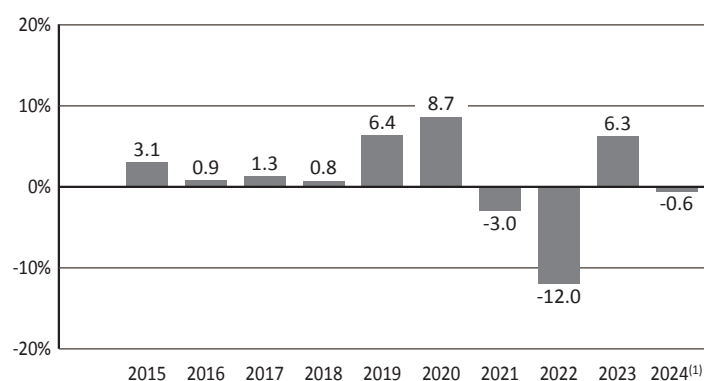
The Fund's performance numbers assume that all distributions are reinvested in additional units of the Fund. If you hold this Fund outside of a registered plan, income and capital gains distributions that are paid to you increase your income for tax purposes whether paid to you in cash or reinvested in additional units. 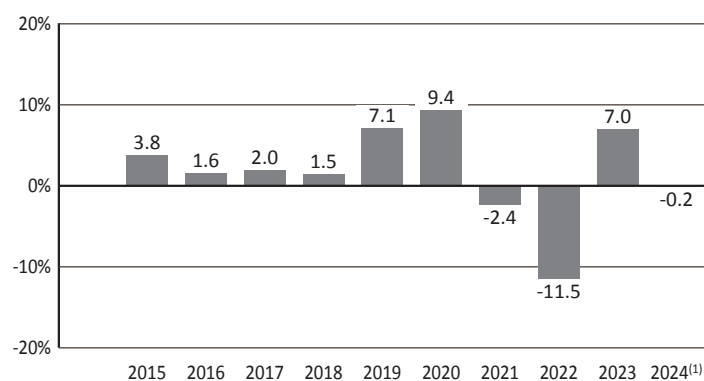
Year-by-Year Returns

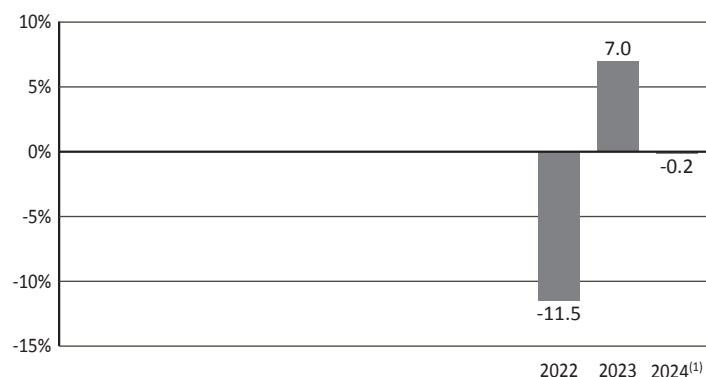
Series A

Annual Compound Returns

The FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index is designed to be a broad measure of the performance of the Canadian investment-grade fixed income market, covering bonds with term to maturity of more than one year. The purpose of this index is to reflect performance of the broad Canadian bond market. All index returns are calculated in Canadian dollars on a total return basis, meaning that all distributions are reinvested.
